# See your impact

In 2022<sup>1</sup>, World Vision UK supported 3 million people including 1.3 million children in 34 countries. This included responding to humanitarian emergencies in 18 countries, reaching over 500,000 children.

### KENYA – Protecting girls

Worldwide, 12 million girls get married every year before they turn 18. That's 23 girls every minute.² Disasters and conflict have increased poverty, further exposing girls (and also boys) to physical, sexual and/or emotional violence. World Vision works with communities and local faith leaders to protect girls and keep them in education. Leah, 14, was inspired to fight for the rights of children in her community after taking part in a World Vision mentorship programme. She learnt about the impact of female genital

### DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO – Responding to emergencies

Chance lost her father, grandmother, and her home when floods swept through her village in eastern DRC. Now taking care of her younger brothers in a camp, she's receiving support from World Vision.

This includes food, but also an intimate hygiene kit with soap, underwear, cloth sanitary towels and a bucket with a lid.

"I'm proud to receive yet another intimate hygiene kit through World Vision, because the first one was swept away by the disaster," says Chance, 14.

### SYRIA - Fighting hunger

Climate change, disasters, conflict, and the rising cost of living are worsening existing hunger hotspots and producing new ones. Children are often the worst affected, including fourteen-month-old Tamer\*.

When World Vision screened

Tamer he was found to be "severely malnourished". Three and a half months of monitoring and dietary changes mean he's now a healthy weight.

Each year, thanks to supporters, the global World Vision partnership provides emergency support to 5 million children like Tamer.

KENYA – Adapting to climate change

Many fragile countries endure the effects of climate change through droughts, floods, mud slides and locusts, which threaten lives and livelihoods. In Kenya, we work with communities to protect and restore water sources and storage. We also improve families' livelihoods by teaching better farming techniques.

"Since we grow many food crops, we are able to get carbohydrates, vitamins and proteins in our diet," says Anita, 11.


We're dedicated to investing in sustainable change - the kind that can last for generations.


